IMPROVING OUR RESILIENCE TO CLIMATE CHANGE

Preparing for the impacts of climate change is a major priority for Wellington

Our seawalls play a crucial role in protecting our runway from storms and rising sea levels, two issues we know are going to intensify in the future.

This is especially important for the western seawall which also protects roading and the major sewer pipes to and from Moa Point.

These seawalls are nearing the end of their natural life, so we are at the early stages of thinking about replacement work.

It's likely to be several years before any work begins and we will be talking to the local community as we develop plans and ideas.



SHOP OR DINE AND PARK FOR **FREE ON WEEKENDS**

Shoppers purchasing over \$50 worth of goods will receive two-hours free parking on a Saturday or Sunday.

Talk to our retail staff when making an eligible purchase and they'll provide a voucher which can be exchanged at the Parking Services Office on level 1 of the Multi-Level Carpark for your free parking.

NEW ELECTRIC BUS DEPOT ON THE WAY You may have noticed a lot of construction work happening opposite Burger King and

the Z service station near the airport. We're building an electric bus charging

facility here to support the new airport bus service, along with a rental car storage area.

The site is being carefully designed to ensure the boundary presents a green and attractive space with fences and hedges to integrate with the residential surroundings.

THE FUTURE FOR WELLINGTON AIRPORT - OUR 2040 MASTERPLAN

In December 2019 we published the final version of the Airport's 20-year Masterplan, after a period of public consultation.

This outlines what we need to do to cope with future demand, and ensure we're flexible and resilient to a changing climate.

Over the next 30 years Wellington's population is expected to grow by up to 80,000 which will mean more people travelling. We also need to handle new and sustainable forms of air travel, like electric flights and zero emission fuels like hydrogen.

All of this means we need more space, especially since we are already tightly crammed into a relatively small area.

That's why we purchased the southern half of Miramar Golf Course in 2019. While Covid-19 has put the brakes on, over the coming years we will need to gradually expand into this space to meet the needs of Wellington.

What's happening with the runway extension?

This is one of the most common questions we get asked! The short answer is it's 'on pause' while we investigate the work required to repair and upgrade the existing sea wall.

We still think that eventually it would deliver enormous benefits to the wider Wellington region by better connecting us to the world. It would also have sustainability benefits, given it would mean fewer connecting flights and reduce the overall fuel used by travellers.

CELEBRATING OUR AMBASSADORS

We're very proud of our Wellington Airport Ambassadors who provide a friendly, helpful and welcoming presence for travellers.

The team of 46 volunteers receive full training to help people with all kinds of queries, from finding their gate to helping with lost property.

According to Ambassador Maureen Groucott, "just being able to help people" is the best part of the role.

"An airport can be a bit confusing and overwhelming for some people. It's magic to be the one to help them and ease their worries."
