

# GOOD THINGS GROWING AT WELLINGTON AIRPORT'S COMMUNITY GARDEN

Our community garden at Bridge Street in Rongotai is growing nicely! A shelter belt and large green crop have been planted in preparation for garden beds and a glass house is now on site, ready to grow seedlings.

Over winter we have composted over 80,000 used coffee cups from the terminal and around 100kgs of green waste per week from Rydges Hotel Wellington Airport.

Our fantastic garden Manager April has run several working bees with keen local volunteers, community groups, school students and airport staff. It's fantastic to have the local community involved, helping us reduce waste and create a circular economy.

This project is a partnership between Wellington Airport and Edible Earth.

## MIRAMAR GOLF CLUB AND

**WELLINGTON AIRPORT UPDATE** 

Over the next few years Wellington Airport will gradually start using part of the land covering the back nine holes of Miramar Golf Course that was purchased in 2019.

The first stage will begin in February next year when we begin work to create a new car park in the area marked as 'stage one' below. Golf will continue to be played over a re-arranged 18 holes until 2025 when the airport takes full possession of the remaining area marked in red below.

These relocated carparks are necessary because the airport is losing carparks in other parts of the precinct. In the longer term, extra space is needed to meet traveller demand from Wellington's growing population and to prepare for new technologies like electric aircraft and alternative fuels.

Future development is likely to happen gradually over time, involving community consultation and a new attractive green buffer zone (marked below) which could include new walkways, cycle paths and plantings.



## WELLINGTON AIRPORT RATED 5TH IN WORLD FOR SUSTAINABILITY

We're proud to have been rated fifth in the world for airport sustainability by an independent global assessment.

The assessment was carried out by a company called GRESB who rate the environmental, social and governance (ESG) efforts of companies who choose to take part.

Wellington Airport scored 96 out of 100 and achieved a 5-Star rating once again. While there's still more to do, we're proud of the progress in recent years including our target of net zero emissions for our own operations by 2030.

We've also converted over a third of our vehicle fleet to electric, and last year we diverted a third of our waste away from landfills.



## RENEWING OUR SEA DEFENCES

Wellington Airport is investigating options for renewing our seawalls and defences which protect vital infrastructure against storms and flooding.

These coastal defences were established between 50 and 70 years ago and are now reaching the end of their natural lifespans. As well as protecting the airport, they also protect Moa Point Road and tunnel, along with major sewage pipes to the Moa point wastewater treatment plant which treats most of Wellington's sewage.

Over the last few months we've been consulting with the community on high-level options which has been very helpful. Further research and consultation will take place before final options chosen and resource consents applied for.

Our first priority is the southern seawall and construction on this could potentially begin in 2025.
