3 DMAPS update

3.1 Jenna R provided the following update on DMAPS:

- Four temporary noise monitors were installed (Khandallah, Broadmeadows, Johnsonville and Ngaio), and a preliminary monitoring report was received by Marshall Day (included in papers sent out to committee). This shows that noise levels are generally within 1-2db of the modelling undertaken prior to approval of DMAPS. It also confirmed that Qantas departures are notably louder than other departing flights and provides a breakdown for the hour of 6-7am.
 - The final nose monitoring report by Marshall Day is due prior to Christmas. Once received WIAL and Airways will consider any next steps.
 - Resident representative noted that the comparison of noise levels from flights with buses/ trucks is useful. Asked whether Airport and Airways response in this matter will set a precedent given that noise levels do not appear breached. Jenna emphasised that it is not a question whether noise limits are breached but more an analysis to compare pre-DMAPS noise levels to current ones. Looking at the difference residents have experienced.
 - Resident representative asked at what trigger point would a change be made? Jenna noted that any consideration of the next steps would be dependent on the final noise monitoring report, but further explained that there is no option for a flight path that doesn't go over other people's homes.
 - Eric M adds later in the meeting that there is a different noise level of 10db between Chapter 3 and 4 aircraft. Chapter 3 aircraft are generally older than the latter and may be why they generate louder noise.

4. Noise Management Plan

4.1 Noise Enquiries Summary

- 2 complaints from Eastern Ward:
 - 1 complaint relating to a flight landing during curfew (this was a disrupted flight).
 - 1 complaint from a resident in Bunker Way about a banging noise from the drop off area which was located and fixed the following night.
- 4 complaints from further afield
 - 1 complaint from Newlands relating to a flight landing during curfew (this was a disrupted flight)
 - 1 complaint from Karori noticing more overflights explained DMAPS, but should not have necessarily affected Karori
 - 1 complaint from Wainuiomata about general aircraft noise

1 complaint from Lower Hutt about a flight circling Hutt Valley between 8:30 and 10:30pm.
This was a night flight training undertaken by Wellington Aeroclub who apologised.

6. Airport Noise Stakeholder Communications Plan

Jo L outlined that Section 8.3 of the Airport Noise Management Plan requires the Airport to prepare a Noise related Stakeholder Communications Plan for the next 12-month period (in accordance with Airports Main Site Area designation). This was included in the papers sent to the committee prior to meeting. Jo noted that much of it includes what we do already but also outlines what we are planning to do. The committee did not have any comments on the plan at meeting, but Jo invited committee to send through any comments prior to the next meeting.

7. Land Based Noise Monitoring Report

Section 6.4 of the Airport Noise Management Plan requires land-based noise monitoring to be undertaken by Airport and presented the Committee no later than the current meeting. Jo L explained that land-based noise monitoring was undertaken during the first week of December. The monitoring report was sent to committee members prior to the meeting. The conclusion of the report was that the Airport's land-based noise is compliant based on observations and sound level recording undertaken (noise was dominated by either aircraft operations or non-airport noises). The report recommends another round of monitoring should be undertaken at night (i.e. during a period post 10pm but before curfew). The Airport will organise for this in the new year and if Council is happy with the approach, present its findings at the next meeting.

8. Quieter Homes Update

- 8.1 WIAL are currently progressing well through Area 4 and looking to have this completed by the end of 2024.
- 8.2 Applications went out to Area 5 in October, and the Airport have already received 43 applications of which site inspections have commenced.
- 8.3 The Airports Quieter Homes Manager also received a late application from a property in Area 2.

9 General Business

9.1 Sea Wall Public Meetings

- Resident rep asked about how the public meetings on the seawalls progressed. Jo noted that the main attendees were board riders/surfer groups. The approach that WIAL is likely to take is to apply for resource consent to renew the southern seawall first before looking at options for the western wall and breakwater. WIAL have requested proposals from the various experts (including noise) to start preparing the consent application and engineers will be carrying out further design work. Still awaiting for mana whenua feedback.
- More consultation will be carried out next year prior to lodging consent (aiming for July/August 2024).

9.2 Development of the new AFS building (234 – 252 Coutts Street)

• Piling is underway which will generate some noise and vibration. WIAL are constantly communicating with the neighbours about this.
